Online Senior Practitioner Diploma

The Diploma is awarded on passing a rigorous assessment by self, peers & tutors involving:

- Two Evaluated coaching sessions by ICF PCC level practitioners
- Video recording of a Coaching session with fellow student assessed by ICF PCC accredited assessor.
- 40min webinar presentation of Coaching model and framework
- Submission of peer-reviewed, reflective learning essays
- Submission of final essay about the theoretical underpinnings of your coaching practice and reflection on your learning
